SECTION 7 - Conditions of Entry/Regulations

- 1. Applications to Enter: Entry Forms must be lodged with the Show Secretary, PO Box 39, Redcliffe Qld, 4020, prior to Friday 7 June, 2024. Alternatively, entry forms can be emailed to: Needlework@redcliffeshow.com Late entries may not be accepted. Entry Forms are available on the Redcliffe Show Website: www.redcliffeshow.com
- **2.** Entry Form: A full description (colour, pattern, size) including the Category and Class of each entry is to be completed on the Entry Form to assist Stewards, particularly when returning exhibits.

3. Entry Fees:

Entry Fees are \$3.00 per entry for Classes 1-65 and Classes 68-69. Junior Section Classes 66-67 are Free.

Entry fees can be posted with Entry Forms or paid for when delivering entries on **Sunday 16 June, 2024**.

4. Number of entries per class

No more than 2 entries by an Exhibitor in any one Class. No restriction on the number of classes entered.

4. Prizes: Prizes may be cash, gift voucher, trophy or gift.

Classes 1-67: First Place \$15.00; 2nd Place \$5.00 OR trophy/voucher of equal/higher value. Classes 68 - 69 First Place \$50.00; 2nd Place \$25.00. Prizes for Champion, Reserve Champion and Best Exhibits range in value from \$50.00 to \$100.00 (cash, gift voucher or prize)

Prize winners names will be released after 9am Friday 28 June, 2024.

Unclaimed prizes will be regarded as lapsed and all monies will become a donation to the Redcliffe Show Society if not collected within 3 months of show ending.

<u>5. Delivery of Exhibits</u>: Exhibits may be posted or delivered in person.

Exhibits may be posted to the Redcliffe Show Society (Att: Head Steward Needlework) PO Box 39 Redcliffe QLD 4020, to be received by **Friday**, **14 June 2024**

Stewards will be in attendance at the Showgrounds (Needlework Pavilion) to accept exhibits on **Sunday 16 June, 2024** from **10.00am to 2.00pm.**

6. Collection of Exhibits:

Exhibits may be collected from the Needlework Pavilion on **Monday 1 July**, **2024** between **10.00am and 2.00pm**. No entries will be returned prior to these times unless agreed by Head Stewards.

If you are unable to collect exhibits during these times, pre-paid postage must be organised by the exhibitor prior to entering.

7. Judging:

Judge's decisions are final and prizes are awarded at the judge's discretion.

If there are fewer than **three** (3) entries in a class, rewarding of prizes will be at the Judge's discretion.

Each exhibit **can not** be entered in more than one class.

Framed exhibits must not exceed 70cm x 70cm.

Articles must be completed within the last 12 months.

Washed or worn exhibits will be disqualified.

Stewards reserve the right to disqualify or transfer any exhibits entered in the wrong class, or combine or split classes where necessary.

All care will be taken with Exhibits, however the Society will not be responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits.

8. Sale of Exhibits:

Exhibits may be sold at the Show. Please put a "size" (where applicable) and "price" on articles of clothing or other items to be sold.. A commission of 10% will be charged for items \$50.00 and over sold during the Show.


