HORTICULTURE SECTION

Regulations

1. Entries close **Thursday 25 June 2026**. Exhibits in all Sections will be accepted at the Horticulture Pavilion on **Thursday 25 June 2026 between 8.30am and 5:00pm**. **Late entries will not** be judged.
2. All Entries **MUST** be accompanied by a completed entry form with payment. Entries after 4:30pm will **not** be accepted without a completed entry form. Please ensure that all entries are recorded in the correct section & class.
3. **Cash only. Entry Fee is \$1 per entry for all Sections**. More than 1 entry per person is allowed in any class.
4. All entries must be clean and healthy specimens, and free of bug infestation or disease.
5. All cuts in Section 1 to be of reasonable Show standard.
6. Pot Plants and Hanging Baskets must be less than 10kg and/or height no more than one (1) metre, from base of pot, to be an eligible entry - unless otherwise stated in each class.
7. Pot Plants should not be displayed in multiple containers, only 1 variety of plant per pot - entered in applicable class for judging.
8. Exhibits in Sections 6, 7 & 8 must be grown by the competitor.
9. Vegetables must have bare root and/or tops attached where applicable. All citrus have a minimum of 1cm stalk. Plants will be accepted for judging even if foliage is trimmed and supported by stakes, but stakes are not to be higher than plants.
10. The Head Steward reserves the right to group certain classes and allocate prizes at their discretion.
11. Prizes awarded in all classes at Judges discretion.
12. **All classes are allocated both a First and Second Prize. First Prize is at the value of \$10.00 Second Prize is to the value of \$5.00 EXCEPT where otherwise stated. Cash/Vouchers/Products may be amalgamated.**
13. All exhibits are to be collected **after 4.30pm on Sunday 28 June 2026**. Potted plants must be signed out by exhibitors. Prizes as stated at the beginning of each Section **must be collected from** Stewards. Please contact Head Steward for Bump Out time for large collections.
14. Exhibits not collected will be surrendered to Show Society on Monday 29th June 2026 at 1pm.
15. For Safety Reasons:
 - Entries that are received in poor health or seen to be diseased will be quarantined and not judged.
 - Plants that exceed those requirements (Height & Weight) will be disqualified and placed into a holding area.

All care will be taken of the exhibits, but the Society will not be responsible for any loss or damage.

COMPETITION RULES

1. Scarecrows must be freestanding with a size not exceeding 1.5m in height or 1m in width.
2. Each Group is permitted to provide one (1) scarecrow, and it must be movable.
3. Scarecrows and any props must be made from sustainable and recycled materials. No perishable goods may be used in the construction of your exhibit.
4. Pre-moulded or commercially available face (masks) ARE NOT permitted.
5. Scarecrows must be in good taste and not reflect controversial/social or political themes, need to be self-supporting and must have a strong base.
6. Exhibits are to be designed and built off site and at time of delivery you will be allocated 30mins to assemble & display your Exhibit. (Exhibits will be moved by the Committee after judging as required).
7. All scarecrows are to have a secure tag with scarecrow’s name on the front, with group name and contact number on the reverse side, as follows:
