SECTION 7 - Conditions of Entry/Regulations

1. Applications to Enter: Entry Forms must be lodged with the Head Steward Needlework, PO Box 25, Margate Beach Qld, 4019, prior to **Friday 5 June, 2026**. Alternatively, entry forms can be emailed to bmapp@optusnet.com.au
Late entries may not be accepted. Entry Forms are available on the Redcliffe Show Website: www.redcliffeshow.com

2. Entry Form: A full description (colour, pattern, size) including the Category and Class of each entry is to be completed on the Entry Form to assist Stewards, particularly when returning exhibits.

3. Entry Fees:

Entry Fees are **\$3.00 per entry** for Classes 1-60 and Classes 63-65.
Junior Section Classes 61-62 are Free.

Entry fees can be posted with Entry Forms or paid when delivering entries on **Sunday 14 June 2026**.

4. Number of entries per class:

No more than 2 entries by an Exhibitor in any one Class. No restriction on the number of classes entered.

5. Prizes: Prizes may be cash, gift voucher, trophy or gift.

Classes 1-62 and 66-69: First Place \$15.00; 2nd Place \$5.00 OR trophy/voucher of equal/ higher value. Classes 63 - 65 First Place \$20.00; 2nd Place \$15.00.
Prizes for Champion, Reserve Champion and Best Exhibits range in value from \$30.00 to \$100.00 (cash, gift voucher and or prize).

Unclaimed prizes will be regarded as lapsed and all monies will become a donation to the Redcliffe Show Society if not collected within 3 months of show ending.

6. Delivery of Exhibits: Exhibits may be posted or delivered in person.

Exhibits may be posted to the Redcliffe Show Society (Att: Head Steward Needlework) PO Box 25 Margate Beach QLD 4019, to be received by **Friday 12 June 2026**.

Stewards will be in attendance at the Showgrounds (Needlework Pavilion) to accept exhibits on **Sunday 14 June 2026** from **10.00am to 2.00pm**.

7. Collection of Exhibits:

Exhibits may be collected from the Needlework Pavilion on **Monday 29 June, 2026** between **10.00am and 2.00pm**. No entries will be returned prior to these times unless agreed by Head Stewards.

If you are unable to collect exhibits during these times, pre-paid postage must be organised by the exhibitor prior to entering.

8. Judging:

Judge's decisions are final and prizes are awarded at the judge's discretion.

If there is a minimum of **three (3)** entries in a class, awarding of prizes will be at the Judge's discretion.

Each exhibit **cannot** be entered in more than one class.

Framed exhibits must not exceed 70cm x 70cm.

Articles must be completed within the last 12 months.

Washed or worn exhibits will be disqualified.

Stewards reserve the right to disqualify or transfer any exhibits entered in the wrong class or combine or split classes where necessary.

All care will be taken with Exhibits; however the Society will not be responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits.

9. Sale of Exhibits:

Exhibits may be sold at the Show. Please put a "size" (where applicable) and "price" on articles of clothing or other items to be sold.

CLASS CATEGORIES

Category A. Lace - any type of lace

Tatting, Bobbin, Crocheted, Knitted, Needle, Etc.

CLASS

1. Tatting—Doily or Runner
2. Crocheted or Knitted lace - any article
e.g. Coffee cloth, Tray cloth, Table mat
3. Needle Lace - An article of any form of needle lace
4. Any Other Article—eg contemporary, Modern/3D
5. Article of lace work made by Exhibitor who is a novice or never won a prize in Lace at the Redcliffe show

Category B. Crochet

CLASS

6. Crocheted Baby Garment—newborn to 18 months
eg. Bonnet, Booties, Dress, Matinee jacket (*Shank buttons, beads and twisted cord are not permitted in baby's wear*)
7. Crocheted Child's Garment—Under 12 years of age
8. Crocheted Adult's Garment eg jumper, cardigan, vest etc
9. Crocheted Rug or Knee Rug—not to exceed 150cmx150cm
10. Miscellaneous item
eg. Tea cosy, Cushion, Basket, Wall Hanging, Beanie, Scarf
11. Creative Item – Let your imagination run wild
12. Article of Crochet made by Exhibitor who is a novice or never won a prize in Crochet, at the Redcliffe show

Category C - Knitting

CLASS

13. Hand Knitted Baby Garment - newborn to 18 months
e.g. Bonnet, Booties, Dress, Matinee jacket (*Shank buttons, beads and twisted cord are not permitted in baby's wear*)
14. Hand Knitted Child's Garment—Under 12 years of age
15. Hand Knitted Adult's Garment
16. Hand Knitted Rug or Knee Rug, not to exceed 150cm x150cm
17. Miscellaneous Item— Throws, Cushions, Beanies, socks
18. Creative Item – Let your imagination run wild
19. Article of Knitting made by Exhibitor who is a novice or never won a prize in Knitting at the Redcliffe show

Category D - Fibre Crafts

CLASS

20. Hank of Pure Wool hand spun by Entrant
21. Hank of Fibre hand spun by Entrant
e.g. Silk, Mohair, Alpaca or mixture of fibres
22. Hank of Novelty Yarn hand spun by Entrant
23. Hank of Dyed Yarn - List Dying Process used
e.g. Plant dyes, Commercial dyes, Household products.
24. Article made from Yarn hand spun by Entrant
e.g. Crochet or Knitting
25. Article of Weaving
e.g. Item, Clothing, Yardage for same

Category E - Embroidery

Exhibits must not exceed 70cm x 70cm including frame

CLASS

26. Any Article - Cross Stitch. Not to exceed 60cm x 90cm including frame. Must be on Evenweave fabric. Predominantly Cross Stitch but may include other stitches e.g. chain, eyelets, french knots, Rococo stitch, Satin stitch or beads
27. Any Article – Counted Threadwork. Not to exceed 60cm x 90cm. May include a combination of counted thread techniques e.g. Hardanger, drawn fabric, pulled thread, cutwork, blackwork. May be traditional, contemporary or creative
28. Any article of Creative Surface Embroidery Techniques not otherwise catered for; eg needle painting. Not to exceed 60cm x 90cm including frame. May be traditional or contemporary
29. Hand Embroidered - Any Article of Household Linen
30. Any Other Embroidery not specified
31. Article of Embroidery made by Exhibitor who is a novice or never won a prize in Embroidery at the Redcliffe show

Category F - Sewing

CLASS

32. Infant's Garment—Under 3 years including sleepwear/ Beachwear (Hand or machine embroidery permitted)
33. Children's Garment or Fancy-Dress Costume—3 to 10 years
34. Any machine-made item—eg Cushion Cover, Apron, Table runner
35. Sewn Toy or Animal (any soft materials). Can be hand or machine sewn

36. Any Other Article of Sewing not specified
37. Article of Sewing made by Exhibitor who is a novice or never won a prize in Sewing at the Redcliffe show

Category G - Smocking

CLASS

38. Smocking (Bishop/Round Yoke Garment (to suit any age)
39. Smocking—Child's Garment 0-12 years
40. Smocking - any other smocked article including adult wear

Category H – Quilting/Patchwork

CLASS

41. Patchwork—Wall Hanging, Table runner or Placemat
Machine or hand-stitched and quilted applique optional. Width and height not to exceed 1m x 1.2m includes wall hangings
42. Patchwork—Bag
e.g. fashion, baby, craft. Machine or hand-stitched.
Embellishments accepted
43. Article of Quilting – Between 1m & 2m not finished by a commercial quilter
44. Article of Quilting - Between 1m & 2m
45. Creative Article - Not to exceed 1m x 1.5m. Can include patchwork quilting. Trapunto embellishments and related techniques permitted eg cushion covers, vest, teddy etc.
46. Any Other Article of Quilting or Patchwork not specified
47. Article of Quilting/Patchwork made by Exhibitor who is a novice or never won a prize in this Category at the Redcliffe Show

Category I – Dolls, Toys and Teddy Bears/Furry Friends

CLASS

48. Bride Doll and or Groom. Clothing can be machine or hand sewn
49. Modern Doll—Fun or Fantasy. Machine stitching is permitted May include angels, fairies and elves etc. Doll to be handmade
50. Teddy Bear or Furry Friend – Dressed. Bear or Furry Friend and clothing is judged. Not to exceed 60cm in height
51. Soft Doll or Toy – Sewing (material only), eg rag doll
52. Soft Doll or Toy - Knitting / Crochet
53. Doll, Toy or Bear /Furry Friend made by Exhibitor who is a novice or never won a prize in this Category at the Redcliffe show

Category J - Miniature / Small Article

Size must be under 16cm in any direction - height, length, depth.

CLASS

54. Painted Model Figure – Any miniature painted model, base can be 3D model or kit. Maximum size 50cm x 50cm; eg Fantasy, Science Fiction, Wargaming
55. Create a 3D scene from wood, paper, resin, glass, plastic, metal or other material in 1/12 scale or smaller e.g. fairy garden, building, doll house
56. Any Miniature article. A single piece 1/12 scale or smaller

Category K. Textile Art

CLASS

57. Textile Homewares—Hand or machine sewn eg cushions, napery, lamp shades, pencil case etc
58. Textile Article - any medium

Category L - Handcraft—Restricted

Restricted to entrants over 75, residents of nursing homes, hostels and those with disabilities

59. Any article of handcraft
Eg a knitted scarf, a simple cross-stitch design, a small crochet piece, throw pillows, heating bag.
60. Special Occasion – any medium
Eg, Christmas, wreath, ornament, Easter Bunny, Halloween

Category M - Junior (Entry free)

CLASS

61. Under the age of 14 years
Any Creative Needlework medium - any article

CLASS

62. 14 years to 18 years
Any Creative Needlework medium - any article

Category N - Millinery

CLASS

63. A handmade hat or headpiece suitable for daytime Spring or Winter event
64. Fun or Fantasy hat or headpiece in any style
65. Beginners/Novice: Handmade hat or headpiece in any style or material

Category O – Lifestyle Technology - Secondary School

(Restricted to Secondary School student entries only) Entry Free

CLASS

66. Year 7 to 8 - Creative Textile – Item/Garment sewn/made by student
67. Year 9 to 10 – Creative Textile – Item/Garment made from re-purposed textiles
68. Year 10 – Fashion – Garment in any Needlework medium, e.g. Dress, Pants, Shorts etc.
69. Year 11 to 12 – Fashion – Garment in any Needlework medium e.g. Dress, Pants, Shorts etc.

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

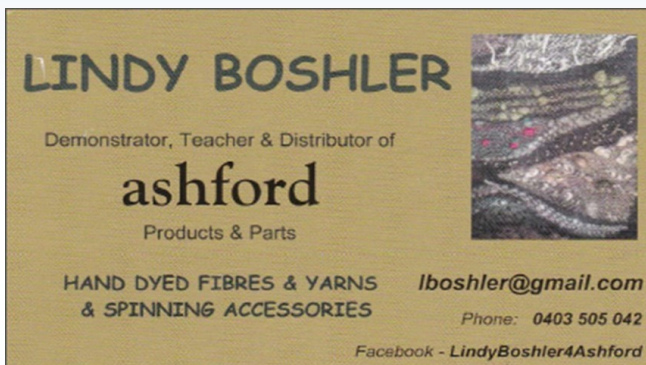
